Travel to and from the stadium – Exposure to COVID-19 may occur during transit.

Exposure could include the team becoming infected, match officials, staff members and volunteers.

Government guidance is to use alternative means to public transport when possible.

Team, Officials, Staff, Volunteer and Press,

General guidance -

Where possible use alternative transport to public transport, such as cycling, walking and private vehicles. However, NFFC staff members are briefed that when using Public transport (where possible) they try to -

- Avoiding overcrowded public transportation
- 2) Wear face masks and other PPE as required by local authority when using transport
- 3) Maintaining safe distance from other passengers where possible
- 4) Using hand sanitizer when entering and exiting NFFC.

NFFC Teams – HOME GAMES

All teams to be briefed that that the following should be adopted by each player –

- 1) Arrive for training and matches in own personal cars or by via means such as bike or walking.
- 2) Not car share outside of their household or social bubble unless unavoidable.
- 3) Sanitisation to be made at regular intervals by all.

NFFC Teams - AWAY GAMES

For away games the following will be adopted where possible –

- 1) The team will be encouraged to share cars with the same people each time
- 2) Open windows for ventilation
- 3) Face away from each other
- 4) Wear a face covering as well as yourself
- 5) Regular sanitation to be made.

Where transport individually is not possible then the following should be adopted when car sharing -

- 1) If ride-sharing keep to small groups
- 2) Consider using solo transit modes such as bikes, scooters, cars
- 3) Open windows for ventilation
- 4) Face away from each other
- 5) Ask the driver and passengers to wear FACE COVERINGS as well as yourself
- 6) Maximise seating distance between people in the vehicle

SELF REGULATION and CONTROL IS REQUIRED BY ALL AT ALL TIMES

Coach Travel/ Mini bus travel if essentially required will ensure that –

- Seating arrangements will maximise space between the staff and team
- 2) Windows open for ventilation
- Wear face coverings on the coach regular sanitisation of hands by passengers
- 4) Limit time spent in garages or stops
- 5) Hand washing for 20 secs at these facilities or sanitise soon after visiting rest areas.

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Stadium entry – Exposure to COVID-19 may occur from touch points and inadequate social distancing on Matchday. Teams and staff members may be at particular risk from touch points where members of the public may also enter. All team members briefed to arrive at a certain time well in advance of the arrival of spectators. Sanitisation to be positioned for use on entrance, at touch points and further positions around the sites, particular in changing rooms. One way system to be used when entering Team trained on COVID protocols and SOP's for safe interaction with others. Declaration of health is taken by the team managers on arrival. Signage – NFFC branded signage to be displayed to provide COVID requirements of site and messaging on behaviours expected. - External signage and control of external queues (where required) is in place.
- "Safety team" in pace to welcome guests and direct to queuing areas and barriers.
- "Safety team" to manage flow of customers and direct to certain areas.
- Government guidelines are currently at 1m+ mitigation and NFCC will try to maintain and enforce the guidance of the SGSA where possible for customer confidence.
- Rows in front and behind of static seating and standing positions will be removed from sale and blocked in the system if LESS than 1m from another person. If over the 1m measurement then will remain in sale.
- There will be some crossing in the aisles at close proximity however this will be impossible to eliminate and represents that same hazard at present when crossing someone in the supermarket aisle and is for temporary seconds in time. The guidelines do not prevent this from happening and is the only way to get into some seats
- The disabled bays will be limited so that the same distancing strategy is in place where disabled bays for wheelchairs maybe closer than the government guidelines for distancing.
- Where there is a pinch point on entry or in navigating around safely will have additional seating blocked out where applicable.











Dealing with disability – COVID -19 does impact on the service and manoeuvrability of disabilities of all types.	 "Safety team" to highlight and assist those with disability issues when highlighted or made aware. Guests identifying a disability will be fast tracked to avoid pinch points. Normal disability and carer provisions are in force even during COVID. Wheelchair users to be escorted to disabled seating or balconies as per normal. Emergency procedures DO NOT change during COVID. As per training LIFE preservation takes priority over COVID requirements. Evac chairs and evacuation techniques including First aid will be actioned, however consider if you need PPE when administering it. Viewing positions to be reduced to 3 wheelchair bays in the normal position with 1 carer per person. Security arrangements – New procedures may be tested by members of the public through negligence or ignorance and security provision may be required to alleviate situations that could escalate. Common areas – BAR, CATERING, CLUB SHOP AND THE BOARDROOM

These areas represent potential for high COVID-19 transfer due to congestion and multiple users' increasing touch points and chance of transference.

All staff and visitors

Bar Areas – (See separate RA for more details).

- Workplace messaging established and communicated prior to return and also inhouse signage
- 2) Installation of hand sanitisers in entrances and other common areas to be carried out
- Floor markings or the installation of oneway systems to control personnel flow through the open plan areas will be in place.
- 4) Areas such as bar seating to be spaced out to promote distancing measures
- 5) Cleaning guidelines and regimes to be enhanced on cleaning on travel routes and high touch areas wipes and sanitiser to be made available at these locations.
- 6) All furniture to be spaced accordingly
- 7) Cleaning protocols to remain in place and be enhanced with regular clean down and item removal.

Food areas -

- 1) Kitchen area to have a maximum number of persons identified for use at any time.
- 2) As preparation area is smaller than social distancing rules 1 in 1 out system may be adopted to manage traffic flow.
- 3) Cleaning of regularly touched machinery to be carried out.
- 4) Eliminate open food items
- Minimise touch points by removing communal food items such as coffee/ tea etc.
- 6) Pre-packaged food to be encouraged
- 7) Players meals to be served individually prepared and wrapped at the end of the game.
